### A MESSAGE FROM FATHER ANDREW

### **CHRIST IS RISEN!**

### **ENDURANCE**

Time does fly by! It is hard to believe that is has over ten years since we opened the doors to our church here in Ocean and consecrated the church five months ago! It seems like just yesterday! We truly have endured over the years and our church community has grown. Having just celebrated Pascha on April 24th and endured the Great and Holy Lent, I would like to look at endurance in our lives and how we as Christians keep moving toward Our Lord and Savior.

Most of use learn endurance when we play sports. However, education and life in general teaches us about endurance. But how about endurance in the Church? Many of us have endured this last Lent while fasting. Oftentimes, the difference between sainthood and spiritual failure is attributed to the gift of patience, i.e., endurance. The saints fervently prayed and put to good use their struggles. They never ceased to remember the wonderful admonition of St. Paul who wrote, "For you have need of endurance, so that you may do the will of God and receive what is promised" (Hebrews 10:36).

Some of us are often quick to abandon commitment to serve Christ at the first sign of trouble. In the great parable of "The Sower and the Seed," Jesus describes various ways people accept and struggle or not to struggle in life. A person may seem to accept God's promise, but he stumbles in his faith when difficulties arise (Matt. 13:20-21). Keep in mind Apostle Paul's warning that "My righteous people will believe and live; but if any of them turns back, I will not be pleased with him. We are not people who turn back and are lost. Instead, we have faith and are saved" (Hebrews 10:38-39).

Our Lord is completely honest with us and does not hide the fact that the way of discipleship can often be the way of suffering. In his invitation to the Apostles, he said, "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me" (Matt. 16:24). With these words, He makes it clear that faith is not a way to avoid suffering, as much as it is a way to endure pain in our lives. For the mature Christian, faith is not an escape from tribulation, but rather a gracious gift that in time of testing; it allows him to continue to trust in the goodness of a loving God.

I know the road has been long for many of us. However, we must continually endure following our Lord if we are to be successful. Pascha is not the end of our endurance, but only the beginning. As we condition ourselves, we follow the example of the disciples in their ministries as we move forward and continue to grow spiritually. Thus, we continue growing our Parish of St. George and its ministries; building up the body of His Church for tomorrow.

**Full Membership:** Women of the Greek Orthodox faith that are 18 years of age or older.



### How we plan to achieve the Vision?


