A MESSAGE FROM FATHER ANDREW

TIMELINESS

As Greek Orthodox, for whatever reason, going-over will change this slovenly habit we continually need to be reminded of our punctuality and timeliness for attending the services. As we enjoy our summer vacation and begin to plan the new school and Ecclesiastical New Year, I would like to share parts of an article with you that were passed onto me describing some of us Orthodox and why we come to church late. I share this with you out of love and for your self-examination. We as Orthodox have an illness in our church that needs to be eradicated: it is our chronic tardiness to services. EVERY Sunday, and I do mean Every Sunday, at the beginning of The Divine Liturgy (9:40am) there are only twenty to thirty people in church, yet at the call to communion "With the fear of God and faith and love draw near," the church is full. Why is this? Have we been trained from our formative years to do this? Or, is it because we are Orthodox and hold the true faith and need not be on time?

According to the article, latecomers to the Divine Liturgy and church services primarily fall into one of three classes. We are not speaking of those who come late occasionally; there can be a thousand and one justifiable reasons for an occasional lapse. But those who are chronically late and have come to church well after the beginning of the Divine Liturgy; they fall into one of these classes:

1) Unpunctuality in everything. Some people are incorrigible putters. They have never learned to organize their time so that they can do the right things at the right time. They come late to social events, to business engagements, to meetings with friends, and so, inevitability, come to church late. Only a pretty thorough self-

that has been acquired.

- 2) Unpunctuality because of indifference to the Divine Liturgy and the church services. These differ sharply from the first class because the only event they come to late for is an event at church. They get into the habit of coming late because of a halfconscious boredom they experience in church by not participating in the Liturgy. If they ever really analyzed it, they would hear themselves saying: "Liturgy and church services are tedious and long." Usually such latecomers are among those who dash out of church before services are over as if pursued by a demon or called by an urgent appeal of charity or a sudden attack of illness, only to find themselves standing around, really doing nothing once they have made their escape.
- 3) Unpunctuality for publicity reasons. To this class belong the fewest in number, but their motives make them worthy of special note. They come late on principle, because it gives them a chance to display themselves before others by walking down the aisle of a church already full.

What category do you fall into? Perhaps, there are others that can be added to the list? Examine yourselves and allow us to begin to eradicate this illness that prevails throughout the Greek Orthodox Church. Is it illness or apathy? We as Orthodox claim to hold the true and right faith! When the second coming occurs, will we be true to our habits and be latecomers when the Kingdom door is closed to us for all eternity?

"STEWARDSHIP OF WORK"

Selected excerpts from an article written by Fr. Jim Kordaris

"Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men..." Colossians 3:23

In the second chapter of the Old Testament Book of Genesis we read, "The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it" (Genesis 2:15). God put man in the garden to work. It is part of God's plan for us that we work. In Exodus we read, "Six days you shall work, but on the seventh day you shall rest...." The world has changed, very few of us are called to work the land, and our work week may not be six days, yet we are created and called by God to work, and we can serve him through our work.

Some are blessed to follow a career path to a life's work bringing satisfaction. Others may work in a position that may not appear to be spiritually or emotionally fulfilling. In whatever type of work we find ourselves, our work can become sacred when we dedicate it to God. In the words of Mother Theresa, "Wherever God has put you, that is your vocation. It is not what we do, but how much love we put into it."

<u>Life on earth is a gift.</u> The work we do is also a gift if we see it as an opportunity to serve God and others. Saint Paul instructs us, "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men...." (Colossians 3:23). When we see our work in this way, we are able to become Christian stewards of our work.

Stewardship of work teaches us that we don't own our work, our position, our title. We are only stewards of a position for a period of time. We are responsible to fulfill our duties and also to prepare it for the person that will follow us in that position. We may also have the opportunity to mentor the person that will assume our position when we move on, empowering them to apply their particular gifts and talents to take the position to the next level.

Christian stewardship of work also teaches us that we are responsible to those with whom we work and those that may be served by our work. We are called to reflect the light of Christ in their lives, encourage them, support them and even love them. We are also stewards of our co-workers inasmuch as we cooperate and support them in their efforts for the good of all.

In times of trouble or worry, especially over our career, we call upon God to strengthen us, to provide opportunity and to bring us success. When we achieve some measure of worldly success, it is easy to say to ourselves as we read in the Old Testament Book of Deuteronomy (8:17), "My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me." But the next verse quickly reminds us, "Remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth."

As Christian Stewards we are called to give back to God from the "first fruits" of our labor. We support our parish and her ministries in an intentional way and not with only what it left after everything else has been taken care of.

In whatever work we do, we are called to give glory to God for the abilities and opportunities he provides. We do this by caring for the work we do, applying our God-given abilities to our work, and by respecting the responsibilities with which we have been entrusted. We do our best and give the glory to God.

Anastasia, known affectionately as Tasoula, was born on the island of Thassos, Greece and spent her early childhood there before moving to Kavala. She was a studious child and dutiful sister to her younger brothers, Rallis and Stavros. Anastasia went on to study at the University of Thessaloniki and earned her degree in Philology, which is the study of the classics. She worked on archaeological digs, in museums and taught Greek, Ancient Greek, Latin and history at a high school.

In 1970, she attended a wedding on the island of Mytilene where she met her future husband, George. George was on his first visit to Greece after moving to the United States with his family in 1956. They married the following summer in Kavala, settled in Eatontown, and she started attending St. George in Asbury Park. Tasoula gave birth to her two daughters, Maro and Pamela, and in 1979, she decided to go back to teaching. Many of us fondly remember Kiria Tasoula as the Greek School Director and teacher at St. George for 29 years!

She was a dedicated caregiver to her mother, Smaro, throughout her struggle with Parkinsons until Kiria Smaro's passing.





Father of the Year: Fr. Andrew Eugenis Biography

Andrew Nicholas Eugenis was born on November 28th, 1959, in Chicago, Illinois to Nicholas and Dorothy Eugenis. Being the youngest among his two siblings, Brother Ted, and Sister Irene, Father Andrew and his family found a deep connection to the Greek Orthodox Church within the welcoming embrace of St. John the Baptist Church in Des Plaines, Illinois. Growing up, he fell in love with the Greek Orthodox faith, however, his calling to the priesthood was not immediately evident. During his upbringing, Father Andrew led an engaging childhood, immersing himself in the outdoors, playing sports, particularly ice hockey, and enjoyed getting his hands dirty. As he matured, his innate talent for fixing anything and everything he could get his hands on earned him the affectionate nickname "MacGyver" from friends and family. It was this unique ability that sparked his interest in the engineering field, leading him to pursue engineering classes while a student at East Lyden High School.

Following his graduation from East Lyden High School in 1978, he made the decision to embark on a career in the engineering field. In his twenties, Father Andrew diligently worked and traveled extensively, not only across the United States but even venturing as far as Tokyo, Japan where he contributed his expertise in the Electro-Mechanical Engineering field. However, amid his professional achievements, he felt a persistent sense of longing. The unwavering love for the church, which had accompanied him since his early years, beckoned him towards a different path—an unequivocal devotion to the priesthood. To answer this sacred calling, Father Andrew enrolled at Holy Cross Seminary, an institution that would teach him not only how to lead a parish, but ultimately, become the backdrop for a life altering encounter.

Amid his theological studies, in 1988, Father Andrew decided to take a trip home to Chicago to attend a Young Adult conference. On the second day of the conference, while at breakfast, Father Andrew could not help but notice the brunette girl with voluminous hair among the large crowd of young adults. As the crowds of people ate their breakfast and left, that brunette girl stayed and ultimately sparked the beginning of a profound connection—that girl was Presvytera Angela. In 1989 while on summer break from seminary, Father Andrew and a small number of his fellow seminarians embarked on an arduous, nearly 1-month long journey, cycling across the United States from New York to San Francisco raising funds and awareness for Cooley's Anemia. After this bike ride across the country, Father Andrew would eventually go on to propose to Presvytera Angela. Through perseverance of a long-distance relationship and the strength of their bond, they were united in holy matrimony in July of 1991 at St. George in Clifton, New Jersey.

Following their wedding, the newlywed couple established their residence in Boston, Massachusetts, where Father Andrew continued his theological education and eventually graduated in May 1993. Their joy multiplied with the birth of their firstborn son, Niko, in August of the same year. Following this, the family of three relocated to Cincinnati, Ohio where Father Andrew was ordained as a Deacon and served at Holy Trinity-St. Nicholas for nearly a year. While in Ohio, a divine calling summoned Father Andrew, a very pregnant Presvytera and little Niko to the Annunciation Cathedral in Houston, Texas. Here, he embarked on a journey of sacrifice and service and embraced his ordination to the Holy Priesthood. This marked a momentous milestone in his spiritual journey as he served the community as an assistant priest.

In December 1994, their second son, Jordan, was welcomed into the family, further enriching their lives. Several years passed and life at the cathedral was busy. The family of four was soon to grow larger and in January 1997, Father Andrew and Presvytera Angela welcomed the joyous birth of their third son Teddy. Shortly after, Father Andrew converged in his role as Proistamenos of the Cathedral. Under his guidance, the Cathedral witnessed growth and expansion as his engineering acumen would aid in the development of a brand new church complex. He proudly and faithfully served the Cathedral for 7 years. However, in a fateful turn of events, a call from Xenia Morris, former Parish Council President, beckoned Father Andrew to the Jersey Shore to serve as the new Proistamenos of St. George in Asbury Park.

The invitation to contribute to the redevelopment and relocation of the church resonated deeply within the Eugenis family. Prior to their move to New Jersey, Father Andrew and Presvytera Angela welcomed their fourth son Stefanos in March 2001. Finally, with unwavering resolve and the support of their loved ones and the community, they returned home to New Jersey. Shortly after, in May of 2002 their fifth son Markos graced their lives with his arrival, completing their family of five boys. After many years of joy raising a family of 5 boys, Father Andrew and Presyvtera Angela were blessed with the daughter they always yearned for, as their eldest son Niko, joined in Holy matrimony to Anastasia Gregorakis in November 2022.

In conclusion, beyond his role as a loving husband and devoted father to his children, Father Andrew assumes the significant mantle of a spiritual father to the entire Saint George community. His boundless love, compassionate guidance, unwavering faith, and steadfast support have touched the lives of countless individuals seeking solace, inspiration, and spiritual nourishment. Father Andrew, thank you for all that you have done and continue to do for our community. You have had a profound impact on all of us here at St. George and we are blessed to have you in our lives. Happy Father's Day!






