### **SPIRIT OF STEWARDSHIP**

### "Cheerful Giving"

Selected excerpts from an article written by Fr. Stavros

The verse "God loves a cheerful giver" has been used in just about every church fundraising campaign, even the ones that seem to put the giver "under compulsion." We church people I suppose rationalize that maybe with enough arm twisting, people will eventually find the joy of giving. And that is probably not the case.

That having been said, if people are going to give anything, it should be done with joy. If you give a gift to someone for their birthday, it should be with joy. If you give time to your child to play, or to watch his or her sports event, or to help with homework, that "gift" should be with joy. After all, who wants a gift that has been given out of guilt? Can you imagine someone giving you a Christmas present and saying "Merry Christmas! I felt obligated to get you this gift."

We should be cheerful when giving something away. Because if we truly understood what it means to give, we'd realize that we have nothing to give, but only to give back from what God first gave us. James 1:17 says "For every good endowment and perfect gift is from Above, coming down from the Father of Lights". This means that every good thing we have comes from God. So, if we have time, that is a gift from God. If we have a talent, that is a gift from God. And if that talent allows us to make money, that is a gift from God. So whether we are giving time, talent or money, we really are giving it back, because all of these things have their origin with God. This includes giving time as a volunteer, or helping a friend, or giving to charity. It's all really giving back.

Finally, as Saint Paul states for us in 2 Corinthians 9:6, we will reap what we sow. That is true in farming and it is true in Christianity. The farmer who plants a meager amount of seed will have a meager harvest. This is not profound. It's common sense. It is the same with us in our journey to salvation. If we spend our life showing mercy, God will show us mercy. If we do not show mercy to others, He will not show us mercy either. If we have been generous in giving, He will be generous in giving to us His mercies and forgiveness. If we have been stingy, then He will be stingy with us as well. In 2 Corinthians 9:11, St. Paul tells us that we will "be enriched in every way for great generosity." So, let us make giving of anything something that we do cheerfully and with joy, realizing that we have nothing to give, only to give back.

Look for opportunities to give something to someone every day and to do so with cheerfulness and joy!



## AHEPA Hellenism Series

Hellenism is everywhere we look around us and within us. In this AHEPA article, we will explore the most enduring political dispute in all of Grecian history: Athens vs. Sparta.


In the annals of ancient Greece, the political landscapes of Sparta and Athens emerged as contrasting ideologies, each leaving an indelible mark on history. Sparta, entrenched in the rugged Peloponnesian terrain, epitomized militarism with an oligarchic system that prioritized military might and stoicism. Athens, in contrast, birthed democracy in the sunlit Attic soil, where citizens actively engaged in decision-making in the bustling Agora.

At the helm of Athens' Golden Age, Pericles envisioned a city as a beacon for the Greek world. His oratory prowess and strategic acumen catapulted Athens into an era of intellectual and artistic excellence, exemplified by the construction of the Parthenon and victory and peace with the Persians.



Sparta adhered staunchly to its militaristic ethos, with dual kingship and a disciplined citizenry. As Athens grew in influence and power through Pericles' creation of the Delian league, they

came into direct contact with the ethos of the Spartans and their allies. This resulted in the Peloponnesian War, a clash of civilizations, that highlighted the tensions between Sparta's martial supremacy and Athens' pursuit of cultural and intellectual distinction.



As the Peloponnesian War raged on, Athens fell victim to a plague, which saw roughly half of its citizens die, Pericles included! Sparta, though triumphant, struggled to extend its dominance, while Athens, humbled and beleaguered but culturally vibrant, retained its legacy. The legacy of Sparta vs Athens resonates through history, reminding us of the enduring impact of ancient Greek heterogenous political and cultural values.



## § SCHOOL

### **JUNIOR TOPICS (Grades 7-9)**

TOPIC 1 His All-Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew has earned the title of the Green Patriarch, and was named one of Time Magazine's 100 Most Influential People in the World, for His teachings about humanity's spiritual responsibility for taking care of God's creation — planet earth. His All-Holiness stands on the shoulders of Saints, who taught that the world is a gift from God, and that taking care of His creation is a way to connect with God. Explore and discuss the teachings of His All-Holiness and the Saints on the creation of the world. What are some of our practical responsibilities as stewards of our planet, and how does that enrich our lives as Christians?

TOPIC 2 Many of us have heroes to whom we look up. It may be an older brother or sister, an athlete, or a musician. We have heroes in our religious life, as well as people who inspire us to practice our faith. They teach us, usually by example, how we ought to live as Orthodox Christians. Select a Saint or person who has been the most influential in your spiritual life. Describe the particular and practical ways that influence has taken place.

TOPIC 3 On the Day of Theophany (January 6), we chant, "All those who were baptized in Christ have put on Christ" (Gal. 3:27). Discuss the meaning of this hymn and the obligations it places upon us as Orthodox Christians.

<u>TOPIC 4</u> When reading the Parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15: 11-32), we learn about the various stages of repentance. What are they? How do they relate to the reversal of the son's journey away from the father? What does the father's reaction upon seeing his son teach us about our relationship to our Father in Heaven?

<u>TOPIC 5</u> The Orthodox Church has a rich heritage of sacred hymns that "contribute radiant and poetic splendor to Orthodox worship," thus, opening the way to God. Select your favorite Church hymn and talk about how it strengthens your faith.

### **SENIOR TOPICS (Grades 10-12)**

<u>TOPIC 1</u> Slandered without cause, convicted without a trial, exiled unjustly — this was the life endured by one of the greatest saints of our times — Saint Nektarios of Aegina. Forgiving others who hurt us that deeply and unjustly seems almost impossible. What can we learn from Saint Nektarios, whose life was about forgiving what some might call the impossible?

TOPIC 2 Apostle Paul refers to Adam as the first man, and Christ as the Second Adam. The Fathers of the Church, especially Saint Irenaeus of Lyon, refer to Christ and Panagia as the Second Adam and the Second Eve. Why is the Most Holy Theotokos called the "Second Eve"? And why is Christ called the "Second Adam?" How do Christ and Panagia fulfill and go beyond their prototypes?

TOPIC 3 Christ says, "This is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me" (Luke 22:1). He also says, "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in you" (John 6:53). Explore the Orthodox teaching on the Eucharist by reading the prayers of the Divine Liturgy the writings of one or more Church Fathers.

TOPIC 4 The number of natural disasters worldwide continues to increase, resulting in more communities destroyed and more lives lost. How would you respond to someone who questions why God allows natural disasters to happen when we know God can intervene at any moment? If God is all-knowing, all-powerful, and all-loving, how can He allow evil things to happen?

<u>TOPIC 5</u> During the Divine Liturgy, before the Consecration of the Holy Gifts, we hear the priest say the following: "Your own of Your own we offer to You, in all and for all." What does this petition mean to you as an Orthodox Christian? Why is it important for us to focus on giving back out of the gifts we have been given by God?






