Most of you will have already taken some vacation time this summer. Do you feel rested and relaxed, or do you feel the same as before you went on vacation, or even more tired? Some people are more exhausted after vacation and do not understand why! Some even take drugs to sleep, and then more drugs to stay awake during the day. As Christians, we should follow God's plan, to rest one day out of seven. God loves us and knows us, He is our creator and is the physician of our souls and bodies. We must follow God's plan and allow our bodies, minds and souls time to rest and recharge.

Relaxation has to do with the body while entertainment has to do with the mind. No matter who we are, we must take time to physically refresh the body and entertain the mind. If we give praise to Christ fully, then we fully receive back from Him that which He has to offer. If we come late to liturgy, we do not fully receive Him. How then can we expect to deal with the problems of this world if we deprive ourselves of that which Christ has to offer us, the spiritual nourishment for our souls! For us to overcome the pressures of this world we must fully give to God, and then we will fully receive from Him. I pray you will all have a blessed and fruitful Ecclesiastic New Year, but must importantly, be responsible for continually charging your spiritual battery!

Compassionate Stewardship

Excerpts from an article written by Fr. Jim Kordaris

Jesus spoke of love and showed compassion. He taught us by his example to love one another and to be compassionate toward those in need. In the Gospels, we read of the compassion of Jesus:

When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them and healed their sick (Matthew 14:14).

Jesus had compassion on them and touched their eyes. Immediately they received their sight and followed him (Matthew 20:34).

...he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd (Mark 6:34).

Compassion can often mean kindness and sympathy. In these verses, it means something deeper and much more powerful. "And he had compassion" is translated from the Greek ἐσπλαγχνίσθη (esplachNEEsthee) and comes from the root word in Greek for "guts." In other words, it is compassion and concern that are felt in one's guts – a compassion that is felt in a deeply physical way. Compassion felt in this way compels us to respond with love and deep concern.

In the parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus says "But a certain Samaritan, as he journeyed, came where he was: and when he saw him, he had compassion on him..." (Luke 10:33)In the parable of the Prodigal Son Jesus says, "But when he was yet a great way off, his father saw him, and had compassion, and ran, and fell on his neck, and kissed him" (Luke 15:20).

These stories reflect the love and compassion that Jesus has for his people. His compassion inspires and challenges each one of us to live compassionately.

This understanding of the full meaning of compassion in the New Testament means that another person's suffering becomes our own suffering. Compassion in this sense can change the way we live and care for others and for our community. When we feel this physical type of compassion, we are fully and physically engaged. We serve others and care for our community with love.

To love in the way Saint Paul writes to the Christians at Corinth, when he says, "...the greatest of these is love," means we can't live without compassion for others. Love and compassion are not expressed only in our offerings of money and other love and compassion. The love that Saint Paul describes in his letter to the Christians at Corinth is an expression of stewardship. Stewardship is everything we do after we say "I believe." Stewardship is about how we live our lives and make our choices. That means that stewardship is about love and love is about stewardship.

Love and stewardship are inseparable when we consider God's blessings in our life. We use God's blessings with love and compassion for others and to honor, worship and give thanks to Him.

Our parishes can be transformed, becoming beacons of Christian love as we care for one another, face challenges together, and serve our neighbors. We would be known as Christians by the love and compassion we embody as a parish family.

We are called to be compassionate stewards, placing the needs of others before our own. Scripture is filled with passages of God's call for us to be generous, loving, compassionate givers. Saint

Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians tells us of God's call for us to "excel in the grace of giving." We are "hard-wired" to live as members of the Body of Christ and serve our larger community with compassion and love.

The priority of compassionate stewardship is not paying the congregation's bills. It is about how we, as a community, can do God's work with love and compassion. It is less about the parish's need to receive, and more about our need to give. It is our generosity with the gifts and blessings God has entrusted to us. Compassionate stewardship is an attitude and a way of life.

"Let everyone give as his heart tells him, neither grudgingly, nor under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (II Corinthians 9:7)

The condition of our heart-not the size of our gift--is what determines how the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ views what we offer. Giving cheerfully reflects gratitude for His blessings and trust in His provision. It acknowledges that everything we have belongs to God and we are merely stewards.

So allow the joy of giving to fill your hearts as you partner with God. And remember, it's not about the dollar amount but the love behind your gift.

- As faithful Orthodox Christians in the St. George Community, we are called to give our time and talent and to donate our treasure from our heart and to the best of our ability. As proud and loyal caretakers of our beautiful St. George Church, the House of God, we are all responsible for its operation and maintenance in the same way as with our own homes.



 - 4) AHEPA Golf Outing Took place on June 20, 2024 at the Hominy Hill Golf Course-Chaired by Brother George Perentesis and co-Chaired by Brothers George Haloukas, Mike Schwarz, Petros Vlitas, Nick Billows, Sister Jacquelyn Marousis-Bush, Steve Xanthacos, Brendan Ballintine, Greg Billows, Arthur Pappaylion, Paul Kalamaras and me. AHEPA Hellenism Series

Hellenism is everywhere we look around us and within us. In this AHEPA article, we will explore one of the most enduring and unique aspects of ancient Greece: **The Olympics**

Did you know the upcoming summer Olympics in Paris 2024 will feature the debut of breaking (also known as break dancing) as an Olympic event?



Originally held in 776 BC, the ancient Greek Olympics were a cornerstone of Greek culture, blending athleticism, religion, and diplomacy. Held every four years in Olympia (where we get the name "Olympics"), the games honored Zeus and showcased physical prowess and skill among Greek city-states. Initially, the games featured a single event, the stadium race, a sprint of about 200 meters, later growing to include various sports like wrestling, boxing, chariot racing, and the pentathlon (though no break dancing).



The ethos of the Ancient Greek Olympics, emphasizing physical excellence, competition, and fair play, has left an indelible mark on modern athletics. The Olympic Games, revived in 1896, continue to serve as a global celebration of human achievement and unity, transcending borders and cultures.

The concept of the "Olympic spirit" embodies the values espoused by the ancient Greeks: integrity, respect, and friendship. Athletes today strive not only for personal success but also to represent their countries with honor and dignity on the world stage.



In ancient Greece, fires were lit in honor of Zeus and his wife, Hera. Today, the Olympic flame is still lit outside of Hera's temple and carried in a relay, around the world to the site of the Games. This year being lit on April 16 and making its way to Paris for the start of the 33rd modern olympiad on July 26. By comparison, the ancient Greeks had 293 consecutive Olympiads, from 776 BC to 393 AD!




